A MESSAGE FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

“CALLED TO BE”

My three older cousins lived just a couple blocks down my street, so every chance I got I would ride my bike or skateboard down to their house to play with them. Being several years older than me, they had the best toys. Most importantly, they had every G.I. Joe and Star Wars toy in existence. I also remember staring at a creepy Iron Maiden poster in their room, hoping that it wouldn't give me nightmares.

My oldest cousin Jeff had the best toy in the world, a go-cart. I was told it could go 40 m.p.h., and to me that sounded very fast. So after weeks of persistent nagging, my dad agreed to let me take it for a spin. We loaded it into the back of our huge family van and me, my dad, and Jeff headed for the enormous parking lot at Bakersfield College. The best place for go-carting.

Mere words cannot describe the feelings of joy and elation I experienced while whizzing around on that go-cart. I was a racecar driver. I was in the world championship race and no one could touch me. I was traveling at the speed of sound. Which is why it was so hard to believe what I saw.

With the pedal to the metal I looked left, only to see a man on a bicycle matching my speed on the adjacent road. How could this be? I pressed the gas pedal harder... something must be wrong with my car! And that's when it happened—while busy not paying attention to where I was going, I crashed into the curb of a flower bed. According my dad who saw the whole thing happen (bless his heart), the go-cart and I flipped and flew through the air, landing only a few feet apart. Fortunately, I only ended up with some scrapes and bruises, but my father saw to it that I spent the next six months paying back my cousin \$250 for the go-cart.

The author of Hebrews writes, "...let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith."

By the sounds of it, living the life of a follower of Christ has always come with some challenges. A life in Christ means life in community with others, and it requires us to stay focused on what and who

we are called to be.

As we move into this new year, let us consider what it might look like to live every moment—both as individuals and as the body of Christ—seeking to know Christ and to make Christ known. Romans 12:3-8 is our reminder that by the grace of Jesus Christ we are united together as one body with that one purpose. And we will succeed in that mission by humbly using the gifts the Holy Spirit has given to each of us.

That warm summer day in Bakersfield, California I learned a thing or two about the importance of staying focused on what is in front of me. With 2012 underway, what is it that lies in front of us? What is the race marked out for us? Together, let us fix our eyes on Jesus and find out.

UNDERSTANDING LENT

A LOOK AT THE 40 DAYS THAT LEAD TO EASTER

Lent is the forty day period between Ash Wednesday and Easter. We do not count Sundays because each Sunday is a celebration of the Resurrection.

In the ancient church, the season of Lent was the season of preparation for those who would be baptized on Easter Sunday and participate in the Lord's Supper for the first time. For the modern church, Lent is a period of reflection and preparation for Holy Week which culminates in the death of Jesus. During this time, we may take on new disciplines or give up distractions in order to deepen our Christian commitment.

The season of Lent often corresponds with the seasonal change from winter to spring, signifying new life. Let us remember that very often new life comes as an old life dies.

During our Lenten celebration, may we meditate on what we are becoming and on what we are not. Let us meditate on

the many graces given to us daily and give thanks. Let us offer ourselves in new ways to the transforming power of the Holy Spirit so that we may be made "dead to sin and alive to all that is good."

You will notice that our worship will include some changes. The *kyrie eleison* will be added to confession of sins. It is Greek and means, *O Lord, have mercy.*

Using this phrase from the ancient church reminds us to focus on the penitential emphasis of Lent. We will also be using a catechetical question and answer from the Heidelberg Catechism each Sunday of Lent for our affirmation of faith. This is one of the most beautiful statements of our belonging to Christ in all of our confessions. Repetition will help us memorize this statement of our faith and remind us of the constancy of God's baptismal promise to us, even as we often fail in our promise to him.

Finally, we pray the prayer of St. Francis each Sunday for our prayer of the people. This prayer will remind us that God's will for the world begins with a change for each of us. May God bless you as you celebrate a holy Lent.

LORD'S DAY ALLIANCE MEETING

Over its life, the LDA has worked toward the goal of preserving and protecting workers' rights to time away from work responsibilities to worship and honor

the Lord.

Today, The Lord's Day Alliance stands on the edge of a great opportunity to proclaim the message of the Sabbath, a message of spiritual renewal and personal well being, in this fast-paced 24/7, 21st-century American culture.

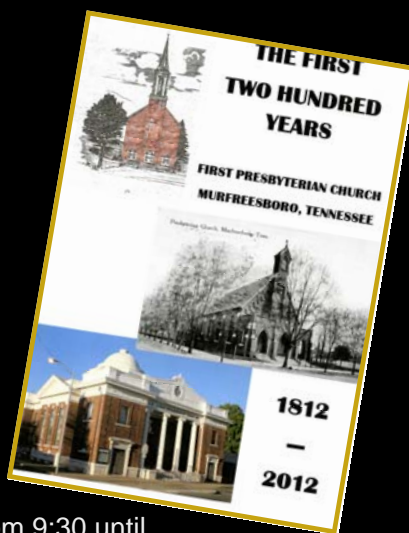
Now Available!

- In March and April, the college ministry team will serve meals for about 25 students at Presbyterian Student Fellowship (PSF). Please contact Kevin Heusinkveld, Amy Maynard, or Glenn Himebaugh if you wish to help.
- A few months ago, Murfreesboro Electric Department replaced the old pole and overhead service line on Spring Street. They also inspected the wiring of the service entrance coming into the church and found it to be deteriorating. We have an estimate from Ogles Electric of \$9,935 to replace the old wiring and install a service disconnect switch which will bring it all in compliance with current codes.
- Rob and Kim Joyner are coordinating the Annual Chili Cook-Off/Brownie Bake and Talent Show (Jan. 29; 5 p.m.)
- Time & Talent surveys are being distributed. The survey's purpose is to offer ideas for opportunities where you can join with fellow Christians to further the work of our Lord. Everyone is encouraged to fill out a copy and turn it in.
- Vacation Bible School, directed by Debbie Edwards, will be held during the week of June 18th.
- Rev. Harding hosted a parent meeting about an upcoming youth discussion class entitled "Good Sex". Thirty parents attended the meeting to discuss content and teaching methods. The course was enthusiastically endorsed.
- The youth in the church have begun supporting a needy child through Compassion International. The cost of \$450 is being met through weekly offerings taken in the middle school, confirmation, and high school Sunday school classes.
- A funeral policy guide is being written to help the church provide the best assistance to families experiencing loss.
- In December, 67 visitors/families worshiped with us.
- The church will participate in the Souper Bowl of Caring Food Drive from January 29 through February 5. This coincides with the Operation Inasmuch Friendly Food Drive among area churches. FPC will give donated non-perishable food items to the Rutherford County Food Bank. Other groups benefiting from donations received by the other Operation Inasmuch churches include Greenhouse Ministries, The Journey Home, The Murfreesboro City and Rutherford County Schools' Backpack Program, and the Journey of Hope in the Midland Community.
- December Care Report: The team provided nine meals for members, and they prepared and served a lunch for 45 following a memorial service. Average attendance at the worship services at Adams Place Assisted Living and Creekside Assisted Living is 20 each month.
- On February 4, Mary Catherine Sevier and Charles Wendt will serve as Elder Representatives at the Quarterly Presbytery Meeting in Nashville.

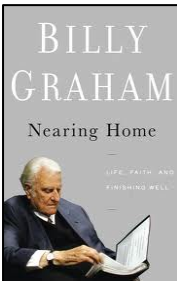

Renowned evangelist Billy Graham offers his perspective on fulfilling
