A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

“ALWAYS FAITHFUL”

Starting something new is never easy.

First, you have to somehow convince yourself that you need to start something new, maybe because the old thing you were doing is not working anymore or maybe because you have convinced yourself that starting something new will improve your life.

Second, once you have decided to do something new, then you have to take the giant step and do it. It is easy to think through and plan and plot out whatever this new thing is... it is another thing to take the first step and do it.

And finally—and this is probably the hardest thing to do when you are doing something new—you must *continue* to do it whatever it is. I read somewhere that it takes two months to start a good habit but it only takes two weeks to end a good habit. The reality

is, starting something new can wear you out because it takes energy and effort to do anything new.

Come January 1, we are all starting new again. A new year. The year 2011 has come and gone and now we are starting all over again. We just got used to one year and now we are starting a new one. Where does time go?

To make matters more complicated, some of us make New Year's resolutions. We know the list by heart: I am going to work out more, I am going to eat less, I am going to spend more time with my family, I am going to have a daily devotion... and so on and so forth. I read once that the percentage of those who actually fulfill such resolutions is very low. I don't actually want to give you the exact number because it might discourage you from making said resolution.

Of late, the only resolution I have made during this time of year is simply that I might live this life listening and observing God moving in my midst. Such a resolution is simply my way of claiming and reclaiming that God is sovereign in both the old and the new. In fact, no matter what I face in this new year, I know God will be with me whatever happens. Interestingly enough, even when I falter in such a resolution I know God always remains faithful.

- **Carbon monoxide detectors** are being planned for installation throughout the entire church property at a cost of \$1,016.00 plus a \$25 per month monitoring fee. The current quote for **additional fire alarms** and the carbon monoxide detectors is \$9,498.00.

- Following the Wednesday evening suppers, Reverends John Hinkle and Kaye Nickell will be co-teaching an **educational seminar**.

- It was noted that Amy Leonard and her staff, who administer and supervise our preschool program are to be commended for their work and dedication.
