Asa Wilson is the minister of the Makason Presbyterian Church on Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota. Asa is a quiet man (or at least he is quiet around me) who moves quietly among those church groups who come from all over the United States to work with the church on various projects.

From a distance it is clear that he gives himself fully to his congregation by providing gentle pastoral care. My clear indication of the love his people have for him is how the children flock to him, always giving him hugs when the opportunity arises. The Makason Presbyterian Church is like First Presbyterian Church.

In talking with one of the Elders last summer, she shared with me some of the church’s great joys and struggles. We talked about the importance of strong Ruling Elders who are willing to give themselves to the needs of the people. In my time at Makason, our mission team worked with children in the morning with VBS and with teenagers in the evening with a Youth Rally, and, even though we are hundreds of miles apart, it is amazing how some things never change. The children want to run and laugh. The teenage girls want to sit and talk about the teenage boys. The teenage boys love to play basketball, hoping that the teenage girls are watching. The Makason Presbyterian Church is like First Presbyterian Church in so many ways.

On June 8, I, along with over 30 other members of our congregation, will leave for the Pine Ridge Reservation to once again work with Asa Wilson and the Makason Presbyterian Church. I am so grateful for the amazing leadership of Dave Baughman and Emily Shacklett and their vision for mission. So often when people talk about mission they think of conversion, but, truth be known, mission is about building relationships. It is about having an ongoing conversation with the sharing of ideas and thoughts. It is about giving, knowing how much God has already given you.

This trip is my reminder of the connectional oneness of being Presbyterian... a oneness created not out of bureaucracy, but out of the desire of people being connected to people through our common faith, a common hope, a common love.

Authentic mission is not so much a desire to change the world... it is more an understanding that the world only changes when such a change starts with you. That is why I am going back to South Dakota. That is why I believe in mission—locally, nationally and internationally—because I have a deep desire to be changed. I wanted be changed into the very reflection of the love and grace of Jesus Christ.

Please continue to pray for our mission team as we head out to South Dakota, and I will continue to pray for you that you might find a way to continue to be part of God’s mission here on earth. If you want to be plugged into mission here at First Presbyterian Church, please speak to Dave Baughman or Meredith Peck. I know we can plug you in.

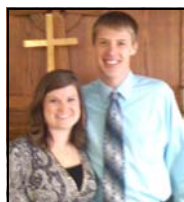
Since the early days of the church, anointment with oil and prayer has been offered as a means of comfort to those who mourn, suffer, or anticipate great life changes.

Upcoming Changes to FPC Youth Ministry

On Sunday, June 12, Bill Shacklett offered a Minute for Mission during worship in which he presented the fall plan for our youth ministry. I'm going to rehash that minute for mission here, in case you missed it!

Bill is a member of our Vision and Support Team (VAST), which is a critical component to youth ministry leadership at FPC. The VAST serves the ministry and helps me think through what the ministry ought to look like. The VAST and I work regularly and in partnership, not only with regard to our programs, but also concerning critical decisions that need to be made.

Many of you already know some of the small changes we made this year. We said goodbye to the youth choir. The youth started meeting as "small groups" on Sunday nights. Wednesday night youth group became a little more structured with regard to our purpose and goals. And a lot of work has gone into and continues to go into building volunteer leadership teams for our youth ministry.

As a VAST, we recognized a few things: (1) The unique and very different needs of middle school kids and high school students, (2) the relationship and faith building opportunities we are missing as a ministry by having these groups combined at all times, and (3) the challenges of both communicating with and engaging in these different groups when they're together. As a result, and after much prayer and countless conversations with parents and students, we have developed a new youth program that will begin in August of this year that we believe fits our needs. Here it is!

- ⇒ **D Groups!** 6:00-7:00 p.m. (**on Wonderful Wednesdays**). These will be our Discipleship Group Nights (Small Groups), which we're calling *D Groups!* These will be groups of no more than 6 or 7 kids, divided by grade and gender, each with one adult leader. The goal of *D Groups!* is to help individual kids take individual steps closer to Jesus Christ. These are gonna be awesome.
- ⇒ **Play!** 5:00-6:30 p.m. On the **first Sunday** of every month we will have what's called *Play!* This will be a combined high school and middle school monthly event of large group games and goofing around.
- ⇒ **Journey!** 5:15-6:30 p.m. The **2nd, 3rd, and 4th Sunday nights** of the month will be separate youth group programs for middle school and high school students. These will be high energy, fun programs focused on Jesus. The Journey is our middle school program.
- ⇒ **Experience!** 7:30-8:45 p.m. Also on the **2nd, 3rd, and 4th Sunday nights** of the month, High school program.
- ⇒ **Serve!** We will continue to have *Serve!* on the **5th Sundays** of the month. That is to say, on those months with five Sundays, instead of meeting for *Journey!* or *Experience!*, our two groups will combine (along with their families) and participate in doing local mission.

With these changes come several ministry needs: **Trust** - Trust that these decisions and changes are in the best (long-term) interest of the students and our church community. **Patience** - Any change causes turbulence. Please be patient with our leaders, with me, and with the VAST as we settle into this new routine, it's gonna take time. **Leadership** - I'm actively recruiting and meeting with potential volunteer leaders. The relationships that the students have with the leaders as well as the adults in our church are what make or break our ministry. If you feel like one of these might be a place where you would like to plug in, talk to me and I'd love to begin that conversation. **Prayer** - pray for us! All of this would be nothing without the presence, grace, and blessing of God.

Notes from Session

- In our worship services, *Time with the Children* will be changed to *Time with the Young Church*.
- During the month of May, 61 visitors/families worshiped with us.
- City Tile completed the installation of the common room foyer floor using Brazilian cherry at a cost of \$7,100.
- The church has been invaded by rice weevils. Keith's One Stop Exterminating has been contacted to eradicate the infestation.
- Mark your calendars for Sunday, August 7. Dr. David Garth and Debbie Garth will be back to help us celebrate our bicentennial.
- Debbie Edwards is commended for her management of the Vacation Bible School. Tracy Webb was able to bring in 25 young people from outside of our congregation. A total of 74 attended on a regular basis. The hard work of several awesome volunteers made it a successful event. Special thanks to Kim and Rob Joyner, Jenna Willis, Allison Panter, Kendra Eller, Beth and Bill Brasch, Tracy Lannom, Meredith Ackerman, Reverend Harding and Reverend Nickell. Youth volunteers were also a wonder to behold. The commitment of all the volunteers was excitingly inspirational.
- Eight youth members attended the high school retreat at Montreat. Plans are being made to return next year.
- Reverend Harding is researching the most appropriate Bibles to be purchased for the Youth room.
- If anyone wishes to be involved in shaping the lives of our young members, please contact Reverend Harding.
- A new confirmation class is being planned with an exciting confirmation curriculum.
- Last month, the Care Team took eight meals to three members with health problems and to two members who had experienced a death in their family. Twelve women provided and served a lunch following a funeral. Communion was served to five shut-ins. Monthly services are held at Adams Place Assisted Living and at Creekside Assisted Living.
- An Ad hoc committee has been created to study the relationship of the campus minister with our church. He is employed primarily by the board of the Presbyterian Student Fellowship (PSF). The PSF board is composed of persons representing our church, the Cumberland Presbyterians and our Presbytery. In the past, there have been verbal agreements as to tasks and monetary compensation. The committee recommended that the relationship of the campus minister needs to be formalized with a written contract which would formally make him a part-time employee of our church, as well as a full-time employee of the board of the PSF. Basically, the college minister will be working with our Cellar group, which is composed of college students, providing a one hour church service with them on a weekly basis and teaching a class on Wednesday evenings in association with the Christian education program. A formal job description and compensation package has been prepared and approved.

Book Review

Review of *Recovering from Losses in Life*

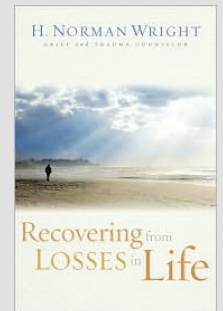

Licensed marriage, family, and child therapist H. Norman Wright provides faith based solutions for dealing with the losses we all face in life. In addition to addressing obvious large losses such as the death of a loved one, he also focuses upon the many smaller, subtle losses which are not always confronted because they are not usually recognized by others as losses.

Wright stresses the importance of identifying and, more importantly, grieving for both your large and small losses. He stresses that you have a choice when it comes to your recovery, even if you did not have a choice in your loss, and that growth ultimately occurs through loss.

Selected chapters address types of losses, the meaning of grief, recovering from loss, growing through our losses, and helping others with their losses. Study questions for each chapter — located at the back of the book — are suitable for both individual reflection and group discussion.

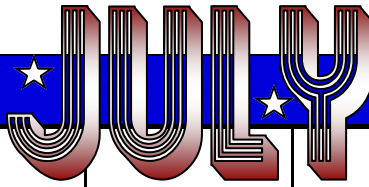
