#### LESSONS ON LIVING IN THE SEASONS

REV. DR. JOHN A. HINKLE, JR., SENIOR PASTOR

I remember a time in my life when, as a child, I yearned to be a teenager, convinced that once I reached that milestone, everything would somehow be different. But, when I finally

turned thirteen, nothing much changed—except the number itself. At thirteen, I found myself longing for sixteen, eager for the day when I could finally hold a driver's license. At sixteen, I looked toward eighteen, anxious to leave home, start college, and step into the wider world.

College brought new hopes of graduation, of entering what I then called "the real world." Little did I know such a world would eventually lead me to seminary. Once in seminary, my sights were fixed on ordination, the moment I could finally graduate, serve the church, and wear the title "Reverend." In my mind, that title would somehow transform my life. Of course, it didn't. Life went on, not with dramatic shifts but with steady, faithful steps forward. I share this with you because it reflects how many of us move through life—always looking ahead, waiting for some future moment to arrive, hoping it will bring fulfillment or change. And yet, as we all discover, each milestone comes and goes, and life continues.

For much of my ministry, one of the few things I never said, "I can't wait for," was retirement. In fact, the only time I ever thought about retirement was in vague, far-off terms—mostly wondering where in the world we might live when that day finally came. I simply set the thought aside because it seemed so distant.

But now, I need to let you know: I've started thinking about future retirement. That doesn't mean it's around the corner, but it does mean I am preparing for when that day arrives. I am 58, which, for anyone who can do the math, places my retirement somewhere within the next six to eight years. I doubt that comes as a surprise to many of you. In fact, I reflected on this not long ago in a sermon. I said then, and I'll repeat it now: I love you, but I don't love you enough to stick around into my seventies. And as Leila gently reminded me afterward, you love me too—but probably not enough to keep me around into my seventies either.

One of the steps I'm taking in this season of preparation is to attend the CREDO Conference this October, a program offered by our denomination's Board of Pensions. The conference focuses on the health and wholeness of ministers, with special attention to the transition into retirement. It addresses practical issues like finances, but also spiritual ones—how we prepare our hearts and lives for a new chapter of service, rest, and purpose.

As I reflect on this stage of life, I am deeply grateful. I have been in ministry for thirty-one years, blessed beyond measure to serve three remarkable congregations. And now, the question before me is simple but profound: how do I finish well?

I can promise you this: I do not intend to coast. My desire is to give my very best in this final season of ministry. I want to save the best for last as together we continue to live out our shared purpose: To know Christ and make Christ known.




