### A HOLY DAY: PREPARING OUR HEARTS FOR CHRIST'S COMING

Every year, Advent asks us to pause in a way the world rarely does. While the culture rushes ahead to lights, shopping, and sentiment, the Church takes a deep breath. We wait.

We remember that the story of Christmas begins long before Bethlehem — in the promises of God spoken through prophets, in centuries of longing, and in the quiet hope that God would one day make all things new.

Our Advent preaching series, "A Holy Day," reminds us that Christmas isn't just a holiday — it's a holy interruption. It is the moment when heaven touched earth, when the infinite became an infant, when the promises of God found their "Yes" in Christ Jesus.

Advent is not only about looking back to the birth of Jesus but also looking ahead to His return. The same Lord who entered our world in weakness will come again in glory. That means Advent is not sentimental; it's profoundly hopeful. It teaches us to live between two arrivals — the cradle and the crown — with faith, courage, and joy.

The Gospel of Luke shows us that the first Christmas was not about power or comfort, but about God's faithfulness to ordinary people: a young woman who said "yes," shepherds who believed good news, and a world too distracted to notice what God was doing. That hasn't changed much. God still works in quiet places and humble hearts. He still brings peace to chaos, joy to sorrow, and love to those who thought they were forgotten.

So, as we light the candles of Advent — hope, peace, joy, and love — we are not merely counting down to Christmas. We are bearing witness to a deeper reality: that God keeps His promises, that the Light has come into the world, and the darkness has not overcome it.

This season, let's prepare not only our homes and calendars, but our hearts — for the Christ who has come, who is with us now, and who will come again.

### MEET SUSIE ROOKER

We welcome Susie Rooker to our First Presbyterian Church family. She has had a long career in the health care field, being the first nurse practitioner in Rutherford County. Susie was born in Murfreesboro, but her family moved to Cocoa Beach, Florida, moving back here in 1953. She completed nursing school in Nashville, and when Vanderbilt University opened a nurse practitioner program, she entered it and graduated.

Dr. William Shacklett hired her to work in his office. "I thoroughly enjoyed it," she said. "I got to get out of working nights and weekends." She later began working for National Health Corp. In 1984, Dr. Carl Adams urged Mrs. Rooker to start a hospice program, and she stayed with it until retirement.

A widow, Mrs. Rooker lives on the family farm. She has a son in Murfreesboro and a daughter in Washington state and four grandsons. As for pets, "I have 12 cows," she joked, plus a watch dog. She enjoyed horses, and used to ride hunters and jumpers and even was a judge of fox hound trials.

She got to FPC over time. "I worked with Debby Garth (wife of former pastor David Garth) and came here a couple of times. I floated around but couldn't find a good fit, but this (FPC) is a good fit for me," she explained. "Which church can help me be the Christian I want to be?" Mrs. Rooker wants to be plugged in here and is making her contributions to our ministries.



### Meet David and Jo Hood

While not exactly new "members" of First Presbyterian Church, David and Jo Hood have entered "fellowship" with FPC. David is an ordained pastor of word and sacrament in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, while Jo is an ordained deacon of word and service in the ELCA. We will explain that later.


David is from Nashville and an MTSU graduate. Jo is a native of Savannah, Ga. and graduate of Newberry College in Newberry, S.C. Both grew up Lutheran. Jo served as Director of Youth and Children's Ministries in several churches.

How did they end up at FPC? They have three daughters, all who live in Murfreesboro. One of their daughters, Erin, is married to Trey Nunley, son of Ann Nunley. Ann invited them to hear the demonstration of the renovated Moeller organ (David studied organ under Margaret Wright while at MTSU) and to the Wednesday dinner before that. "We kept coming back on Wednesdays," David said. Also, "we were looking for a liturgical church, and I wanted to join a choir. I never was able to do that when I was a pastor." Jo is involved with the Care Team and makes home-made greeting cards. We are happy to have the Hoods with us here at FPC.

- Sherri Poole was hired as our new 2<sup>nd</sup> Custodian.




