About Isaiah 117 House: Isaiah 117 house provides physical and emotional support in a safe and loving home for children awaiting placement in the foster care system.






Please join us for a Bridal Shower for Kaitlyn Carroll on Sunday, February 11, from 2-4pm in the church parlor.

Native Nebraskan Norma Christiansen became our newest member in October after moving (back) to Murfreesboro from Lincoln, Nebraska. She and her late husband Allen Christiansen lived here for 45 years when he was in the advertising and publishing business and she was leading birthing and childcare classes at Rutherford Hospital, later Middle Tennessee Medical Center.

Born in Lincoln, Nebraska, Norma is a graduate of the Lincoln General Hospital School of Nursing. "I worked in obstetrics until I got to Nashville where I started teaching childbirth and baby care," she said. The classes later included those for parenting, siblings and grandparents. These classes started at St. Thomas in Nashville and then here in Murfreesboro. Mrs. Christiansen ultimately set up such classes in ten hospitals. "I loved it. It was fun working with the public."

Mrs. Christiansen and her husband lived here 45 years, and then 15 years away, in Manchester, Fairfield Glade and then back to Nebraska. After Mr. Christiansen died, her children told her, "Time to come home," she said. So, she obliged. She has a daughter in Murfreesboro, one in Nashville and a son in Nashville. She also has a deceased daughter. There are also four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. To make a connection, her son-in-law is Hal Hassall, son of former First Presbyterian pastor Harry Hassall.

As for her pastimes, "Music is my first love. I was still singing in the choir three years ago, but it was time to stop," Mrs. Christiansen said. She also stopped driving, but her close friend from her nursing days, Laura Harbour, brings her to church. She enjoys reading and leading chair exercises at her retirement home. Welcome back home, Norma! We're so glad you're here.


