"To Know Christ and Make Christ Known"

Several Sundays ago, I told that old, well-worn joke: "How many Presbyterians does it take to change a light bulb? One to actually change it – and 99 to talk about how great the old one

was." Like most good jokes, it gets a laugh because there's some truth in it. Change is never easy, and for some reason, it seems even more difficult in the life of the church. We tend to love the way things have always been, who doesn't?

But the truth is this: without a willingness to change, without the courage to risk failure, and without a forward-looking mindset, any organization—including the church—is heading toward stagnation. The gospel may be eternal, but the way we live it out is not. It must breathe, adapt, and grow.

The good news? We can change, we have changed. Just think back to the early days of COVID. Before the pandemic, our church had no online presence. We'd talked about it for years, but nothing moved quickly. Then came the "Stay at Home" order, and suddenly, First Presbyterian Church—and churches across the country—pivoted. We learned how to livestream and record worship. We recorded videos. We emailed, used Zoom, and found ways to be the church in unfamiliar territory. It wasn't easy, but it was faithful.

After COVID, we changed again—this time with our summer worship schedule, moving to one combined service. For years, I had wanted to try it, but every time I brought it up, the response was familiar: "I don't know... people don't like change." And yet, here we are—years later—and that change has brought new energy and unity to our summer worship.

Now, we are preparing for another small but significant change.

After prayerful consideration, the Session voted in June to move the start time for Sunday School from 9:30 to 9:45 a.m. Why? Because while the 8:30 a.m. service was initially designed to last 45 minutes, in reality, it's been a full hour for as long as I've been here. And rightly so. Since my arrival, we've added weekly communion. On any given Sunday, we may also have a Minute for Mission, a baptism, or questions from curious kids during Time with the Young Church—plus Phil Purvis being, well, Phil Purvis. It's rich, full, meaningful worship... but it rarely ends exactly on time.

This new 9:45 start time will give Sunday School teachers—especially those serving our children—enough time to move from worship to the classroom without stress. It also gives the ministers a moment to breathe before shifting into teaching and conversation. This one small adjustment will ripple outward with positive impact. Change is never easy, but it can be holy. As we continue to live into our purpose—to know Christ and make Christ known—we do so with open hearts, flexible spirits, and a willingness to trust that God is always doing something new in our midst.

Let's keep dancing forward—one change at a time.






Join Dinner for Eight!

In keeping with (a new) tradition, we welcome former Californian Lea Lea Sands to our church family. Lea Lea moved to Murfreesboro in July of last year, having lived her whole life in the Los Angeles area. So why Murfreesboro?

After the death of her husband, Lea Lea was having a hard time. When her son's company transferred him to Murfreesboro, he said to Lea Lea, "I'm taking you with me". We are glad Lea Lea is with us.

The California exodus continues with the addition of Judith and David Trimble to our church family. Judith, born in Napa, and David, born in Monterey Park, met while teaching at Bobby Duke Middle School in Coachella, Calif. Actually, David was just

The Trimbles lived in LaQuinta, Calif. for 32 years, and after retiring, moved to Palm Springs, 20 minutes away. Judith added that "people have reached out to us," and made them feel at home. "We love this church." They were formerly Lutheran and joined FPC on reaffirmation of faith.

As for hobbies, Judith enjoys playing her seven-foot grand piano. David liked to golf, but mobility issues have ended that pastime. We are fortunate to have the Trimbles join our congregation.
