A TRIBUTE TO JOCELYN REV. DR. JOHN A. HINKLE, JR., SENIOR PASTOR

"To Know Christ and Make Christ Known

I am terrible with names. Studies on dyslexia suggest that struggles with phonics make the pronunciation of words—and thus, names—difficult. Let us go with that explanation. That said,

I must confess that for the longest time, I did not know her name. In my defense, I had just arrived in Murfreesboro as the Senior Pastor of First Presbyterian Church, and my mind cluttered to match unfamiliar faces with names. What I did know was that she sang in the chancel choir Sunday after Sunday, and on almost any given Sunday, her voice, soaring above the others, was unmistakable.

Eventually, someone informed me that her name was Jocelyn. A few months later, I learned that her last name was Fisher. Little did I know then just how Jocelyn Fisher would shape not only my ministry but my life. The first two years of my ministry were consumed with articulating a vision for the congregation—no small task. First Presbyterian Church is an old and stately ship, and, if I may say so, navigating her through the waters of life requires both skill and patience. Committed to serving the heart of our city, our congregation embarked on two significant initiatives: forging partnerships with organizations that love this city as much as we do and calling a new associate pastor to work with youth and families. What I had not anticipated was the sudden need to find both a new director of music and an accompanist.

Jocelyn stepped forward. Not only, she assured me, could she sing—having been trained classically—but she also had years of experience directing church choirs. More to the point, she was willing to help in any way necessary. That offer, made in a moment of transition, became the foundation of fifteen years of service as our Director of Music.

I knew from the beginning that Jocelyn would someday tell me it was time for her to step away. I chose, as one does with unpleasant certainties, to ignore that eventuality. She is my colleague. She is my friend. She is my sister in Christ. She has been not only a fixture in the ministry on the corner of College and Spring but also an integral companion in my own walk of faith.

Our relationship is woven into the fabric of worship itself—manifested in the hymns we sing each Sunday. You may not know this, but Jocelyn personally selects the hymns for worship, and without fail, each one seamlessly integrates into the service, reflecting and amplifying the themes of my sermon. At first, I assumed this was because I shared my sermon notes in advance. That, I am sure, plays a role. But then Leila, in her wisdom, illuminated something deeper. Jocelyn, she explained, does not simply choose hymns based on scripture or sermon themes. "No," said Leila, "her hymn selection is because she knows you. She knows your heart."

For fifteen years, Jocelyn Fisher has blessed our congregation with music that stirs the soul and fortifies our faith. She has done so not simply because she understands the mechanics of worship, but because she understands us—because she knows us... she knows our hearts.


