

SANCTUARY ORGAN UPDATE

In case you haven't heard - our organ will soon undergo some timely refurbishing and upgrading. Due to a generous gift from a member of our congregation, we will be adding some new pipework, refinishing some of the old pipework, adding additional tonal settings, and refurbishing or replacing some of the inner mechanics. During the week of May 20th, the Luley Organ Company will come to disassemble, pack up, and take away portions of our existing organ to do the work in their shop in Pittsburgh, PA. It is projected that we will have our "new" organ back and ready to play in mid-July with the additional pipework to be installed in October. We are so excited and grateful to be able to maintain the excellent function of this instrument. And we thank the congregation for the interest and excitement already shown in this project.





SESSION NOTES BY GLEN EMERY, CLERK OF SESSION

- Our devotion was led by Jill Lanning on Hebrews 11:1 on living a life of faith.
- 11th grade confirmands Scout Harding and Lang McDaniel met with the session. After examining them and their statements for faith, and after they answered the formal questions of their faith in the affirmative, they were unanimously approved for membership.
- Our Director of Preschool, Karen Winford, met with us to describe the replacement of ground cover in the outside play area.
- Work needs to be done on the front doors of the sanctuary. Quotes are being solicited for the restoration. Refurbishing of the rental house continues and should be ready to be occupied next month.
- Vacation Bible School dates are June 5-7. Registration is April 28 to May 15.
- We are thankful for everyone's pledges. To date approximately \$759,000 has been pledged. Budgets will be prepared starting next month.
- On May 11 Presbytery will be holding a quarterly meeting in our sanctuary. All who wish to attend to see how the Presbytery works are encouraged to attend.

- Tammy Green, our second custodian, has been approved for us to hire her from the Manpower temp agency. We are planning to give all employees a 4 percent raise. There are some changes that have been made by the Board of Pensions that will cost us an additional \$12,000 in support each year.
- The welcome sign on the podium on the front porch is being updated. Handouts to visitors are being revised also.
- For the next three months our food drives will be directed to Nourish Food Bank with an emphasis on kidfriendly food. We are revising our criteria for giving assistance to organizations. Primarily we will be addressing the needs of marginalized people. Also we are wanting to have one of our members on the boards of the organizations that we support. The main organizations that we now support: Habitat for Humanity, Nourish Food Bank, Santa Lastenia Clinic in Nicaragua, Makasan church in South Dakota, Murfreesboro Rescue Mission, Still Waters Ministry, the Isaiah 117 House, and Doors of Hope.
- Starting on the Memorial Day Weekend, we will be going to our summer Sunday worship service schedule: Sunday School at 9 am and one worship service at 10:15.

MATAGALPA NICARAGUA TRIP MAY 3-7, 2024



Our travel group for the upcoming trip consists of seven fantastic individuals: Bobby Harding, Travis Lampley, Kit Ramsay, Eve Jones, John Murphy, and Hope and Neeley Emore. 


