
INVITED ON A LENTEN JOURNEY

Growing up as a child up in Dalton GA, First Presbyterian Church did not observe Ash Wednesday, so I never experienced going to the chancel and receiving ashes on my forehead. The first time I worshipped on Ash Wednesday was my sophomore year at Presbyterian College. The worship service was organized and led by the college chaplain, Greg Henley. As I have shared with you before, I was not overly concerned about my spiritual well-being during my first few years at college. In fact, in my first two years of college, I only went to church when I was back home in Dalton, where attendance was highly encouraged. That being said, it will not come as a surprise to anyone that the only reason I was there for this Ash Wednesday service was because of a young lady. It is not what you think. Marian Parker was a senior. She was from Cartersville, GA, and her father was the Executive Presbyter for Cherokee Presbytery. Marian also worked on the summer staff at Montreat.

Marian was a good friend, and she was worried about my soul—well, maybe not my soul, but she wanted me to reconnect with the church, and so she invited me to worship with her on Ash Wednesday night. She got me there because she promised to take me out to dinner afterward. I remember there were a few hundred people who gathered in the student union gym which was dimly lit with a table in the center. After the sermon was over, we were invited to come forward and receive our ashes. I am not sure what I was expecting, but what I experienced was life changing, for it was only the second time in my life when I realized I will not live forever. As it was my time to receive my ashes, my Old Testament professor, George Ramsey, stood in front of me. He placed the ashes on my head and then he whispered in my ear, "You are dust and to dust you shall return. Remember your baptism and be grateful." After the service was over, Marian took me to Whitford's for a cheese hamburger and she shared with me her love for Jesus and she wanted me to know how much Jesus loved me. Marian was killed in a car wreck just four months later. Every time I walk this Lenten journey, I think of Marian, and I am so very grateful she invited me to walk with her on this same path 35 years ago.

WELCOME! MEET J. T. & TONI LEATHERS



So how did a woman from Greensburg, PA (outside Pittsburgh) end up marrying a man from Rockvale? Easy - through a Christian PenPal organization. Toni and J.T. Leathers met, married in 1991, and Toni moved to Murfreesboro. J.T. was a classmate of our own Rev. Joyce

Merritt in Eagleville, so he's obviously not coming in with a blank slate! J.T. is a retired industrial electrician and Toni is a retired teacher, teaching everything from pre-school, special education, Title One and general education. She finished her professional career returning to preschool ("I missed the little ones," she said).

More interesting than his career as an electrician, however, is J.T.'s other career: While in high school, he volunteered at the Stones River Battlefield, and his interest grew. J.T. Leathers is one of the foremost authorities on 19th century artillery and weapons. Your correspondent asked Toni if her husband has appeared on Antiques Roadshow. "Oh, no, he doesn't do that," she said, but he (time to name-drop) is good friends with Rapheal Elledge of Savannah, TN, is a regular on the Roadshow. "He (Elledge) just sent J.T. some (artifacts) to work on." In fact, J.T. was at a special show in Las Vegas when this interview was conducted.

But how did the Leathers, who joined in December, end up at First Presbyterian Church? WELCOME! MEET MARCIE RICHMOND



Although not a native Tennessean, Marcie Richmond's roots go way back in Murfreesboro. Her parents were the late John and Mary Alice Richmond, long-time members of First Presbyterian Church. Mary Alice Richmond, as many know, was the first baby born at Rutherford Hospital.

Marcia Lee Richmond was born in Racine, Wisconsin, where her father worked for Johnson Wax. She moved to Tennessee to attend Vanderbilt University; however, she said "I thought I was going away to school, and my family followed." (John Richmond bought into Davidson Ladder Co. in Smyrna, and later bought-out the company with his son, Bill.)

Life carried her to Northern Virginia for nine years, and she and her daughter Courtney moved to Murfreesboro in 1979. She worked for the Tennessee Manufacturers Association in Nashville for several years, then became the executive director of the Rutherford County Chamber of Commerce for three years, then joined Davidson Ladder. When it sold, she went back to the Manufacturers Association. When Adams Place opened, she became their first employee, serving for 15 years as Director of Independent Living until retirement.

The Richmond family joined FPC in 1969, but Marcie had become Episcopalian when living away. However, she explained, "I got pulled in," a natural progression, and re-joined FPC in November. She is a board member and volunteer at Doors of Hope, an organization which helps to integrate women released from the prison system back into society.

Marcie's daughter, son-in-law John Davis, and three grandchildren live in Auburn, Alabama. She enjoys traveling and reading and has joined the Flower Guild here at church. We mention that Bill Richmond is her brother. Welcome, Marcie!


