ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

We will start the new Sunday School year on August 4 with an assembly for the adult classes in the Sanctuary at 9:30. The teachers/leaders from the adult classes will give a brief outline of their focus and topics for the year. The adult Sunday School program at FPC is loosely organized, with members free to attend any class they choose at any time. We periodically have a fresh start to let everyone know what is happening in our Sunday School program. You will find that each class is interesting and worth attending. We will add a new class this year geared to younger adults. Our five classes are:

- Hippies, Preppies and Millennials, led by Leila Hinkle meets in Classroom A. This class focuses weekly on the 1st and 2nd Scripture readings of that Sunday's service.
- Friends of Job, led by Robb McDaniel meets in Classroom B We have a discussion format and do deep dives into biblical texts, examining them in historical context and looking for what makes the Bible weird, profound, troubling, and beautiful.
- Last Room on the Right, led by Jim Crumley meets in Classroom D The Last Room on the Right is a Bible centered discussion class. Currently, the class is looking at the words of Jesus in chronological order.
- Seekers of the Spirit, led by Bob Hunt meets downstairs in Harrison Hall We focus on reading individual books, discussing a chapter per week as we move through them. We do not have a set curriculum. We choose the books one at a time.
- Young Adult, Coming Soon
 - We are working on a new class especially geared for our younger adults. You might even have opportunity to help us in the design! More information coming in the near future.

The artisans from the Luley Organ Company are now finishing up their work on renovating, repairing and improving the pieces and parts of our organ in their Pittsburgh factory. If all goes as planned, they will be back in our sanctuary to reinstall these pieces and parts beginning July 22nd! They plan to be working here for a couple of weeks as they reinstall and re-voice those previously existing pipes and mechanics. And, there will be more installments down the road. The new, additional pipes are currently still under construction and the work on our facade pipes (the pretty ones that are seen but not heard) will not be completed just yet. We hope to see their completion and return in the late fall.

Good news: It is highly likely we will have organ music again as early as August! We will look to the future completion with excitement but still ask for your flexibility throughout this complicated process, as well as your patience during the remaining installments in the coming months.


